


Working in hospice, hospital, assisted living, skilled nursing facilities and as returning veteran chaplains, they provide ongoing and crisis spiritual care.

events, but in reality they are longer term, inflicting significant impact on individuals and in the same communities over and over. Of all the immediate and long-lasting effects disaster imposes upon its many victims, residue trauma and Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) can be the one thing that holds on and holds back individuals and entire communities for years to come, beyond the time it takes to rebuild.

When all the helpers have gone, people are too soon left on their own to initiate and energize many major projects because most of them are still too tired and traumatized.

Disaster Chaplains provide an initial spiritual assessment and spiritual care, an initial debrief, counsel and referral, or they develop a spiritual plan of care if return visits are determined.

After initial contact, most disaster victims are referred to the existing local faith community faith organizations and resources.

Faith groups can be trained to receive disaster victims into their communities. Online resources to help include flyers, training manuals, and procedures.

The price of relief, counsel and support is much less than the rising cost of unattended grief, PTSD and the enormous effect on its victims, their families and entire communities.
